This course is not about working with clients or horses as individuals, but about bringing them together for a therapeutic interaction that promotes strategies to attain healthier relationships that can improve wider group and family dynamics.

The course consists of hands-on, practical field-based training scientifically based on the latest research. We believe there is no greater teacher than the environment we live in – real-world application is where we excel.

AEFL Team

The Australian Equine Facilitated Learning Team was developed and is run by professional horse trainers, qualified equine scientists, business owners, and equine enthusiasts. – Elaine Russell & Ebony Cox

The experienced equine duo will guide you through your clinic course, are both qualified in equine facilitated learning levels 1, and 2, mounted, qualified clinicians, and trainers, certified in First Aid & CPR, and certified WWC. Both run successful EFL businesses in QLD and Victoria, and ride and handle horses regularly.

Clinic Outline

Trainees will attend the required clinic (L1, L2 or L3) with AEFL Assessors and Trainers, participation is encouraged.

each student will be observed on their abilities of horsemanship and handling, role plays and scenarios, and interactions with clients.

Post clinic self-assessment and Teams chat to discuss areas of competence and noncompetence.

Following this, students can choose to complete the required post clinic practical hours, and relevant paperwork, as per assessment criteria and workbook*

Before engagement with clients, facilitators are required to obtain relevant required paperwork first before they engage with clients in practical sessions.

Students are to engage, plan, produce and record each post clinic client session by video, along with supporting relevant documentation to be assessed.

*Advanced levels will require a workbook to be submitted for assessment.

Pre-requisites

As of 2023, a required pre-requisite for each level is to be completed. The online training modules will refresh your equine skills and memory or expand your understanding of horse care, health, safety, and wellbeing.

Whilst it is not a pre-requisite to have horse skills and experience, it would be difficult to meet the required criteria without having worked with horses in some capacity before. Initially, the work is all ground-based so riding ability is not necessary.

AEFL does not require any medical, allied health, or mental health qualification.

All trainee facilitators are required to be able to obtain a working with children (WWC) blue card, NDIS Clearance, or police check, first aid & CPR, and activity-specific insurance. Attendance does not equal a certificate of attainment. All trainees will need (and have access to) Microsoft Office, internet, email capabilities, and basic language, numeracy, literacy, and or life skills.

Level Summary

Level 1 is open to all to access and can be used for professional development for certificated facilitators and AEFL members.

Level 2 cannot be undertaken without attending a Level 1 clinic – the assessment criteria do not have to be submitted.

Level 3 (Mounted) level can only be undertaken by those who have attended a Level 2 clinic completed the assessment criteria and received a Level 1 certificate.

What Our Graduate Receive

On completion of attending and participating in the clinic, post-clinic self-assessment chat, and post-clinic hours and assessments students will accomplish a certificate of achievement, recognising that they have worked towards specific industry practices, ethics, and standards.

Students will have the knowledge, skills, confidence, and understanding of the expectations of working with clients and horses, and the ability to become self-employed.

AEFL facilitators will have access to further education opportunities, professional development, and the opportunity to become an AEFL Practicing Member.
